




Technology Enhancements



Safety Features

- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
 - Masks, gloves, gowns, face shields
- **Drinking fountains** for filling bottles only
- Hand sanitizing stations
 - 250 between both buildings
 - At all external doors and hallways
 - Individual bottles also in each class







Directional arrow signs for pedestrian traffic at the middle school can be rotated to reverse the direction at different times of the day.



Safety Features

Cleaning products

- Disinfecting wipes in each classroom for student desks
- Super sani-cloth wipes, Flexi wipes, Lysol wipes
- All products have safety data sheets on file
- 8 electrostatic sprayers



Hygiene Safety

• Bathrooms

- Dividers installed between sinks
- Touch-free towel dispensers
- Faucets adjusted/replaced for longer run times
- Social distancing markers on floors




Air Quality Safety

HVAC systems

- Both buildings professionally maintained every year with preventive service for all rooftop units & air circulators
- MERV 8 filters used as designed & recommended by system manufacturers
 - Anything higher than MERV 8 would reduce airflow and potentially damage unit motors & electrical components
- Programmed to increase outdoor air resulting in 6-10 exchanges per hour

Classrooms desks have been only 3 feet apart since the beginning of the school year, the lowest allowable distance per DESE and CDC guidelines, therefore rendering return-to-school announcements moot relative to KP.

Safety Features

- **2-3 custodians** moved to mid-shift in each building to increase daytime cleaning
- Removed furniture to maximize student capacity (file cabinets, desktop computers, etc)
- Socially-distant and compliant cafeteria seating, with overflow in gyms / field house





Custodial Checklists

- Detailed listing of tasks to be performed, along with frequency required
- Numerous additional tasks and/or frequencies added based on COVID-19
 - Clean & disinfect desks between classes
 - Clean bathrooms more frequently during the day
 - Clean & disinfect drinking fountains / filling stations
 - Clean high-touch points throughout the day
